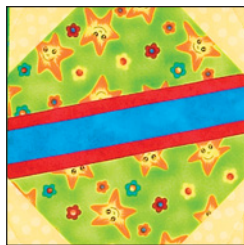

materials

- Assorted Bright Prints**
1 yard *total* for blocks
- Yellow Tone-on-Tone**
 $\frac{3}{4}$ yard for blocks and setting squares
- Green Print**
 $\frac{5}{8}$ yard for border
- Blue Print**
 $\frac{1}{2}$ yard for binding
- Backing** $1\frac{1}{3}$ yards
- Batting** 41" x 41"

cutting

- Yellow Tone-on-Tone**
12 squares (A) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ "
- Green Print**
2 strips 4" x 33" for border sides
2 strips 4" x 40" for border top/bottom
- Blue Print**
5 strips 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 40" for binding
- Backing**
1 panel 41" x 41"

- Take blocks or rows to a local chapter near you and help sew them into quilts on Make-A-Blanket Day, February 17, 2007.
- Make a quilt and send it to a Project Linus chapter or to *QUILTMAKER* by March 30, 2007, for local distribution.

This year's design was created by Theresa Eisinger, *QM* Graphic Artist and mom to four boys. She's spent her fair share of time at ball games.

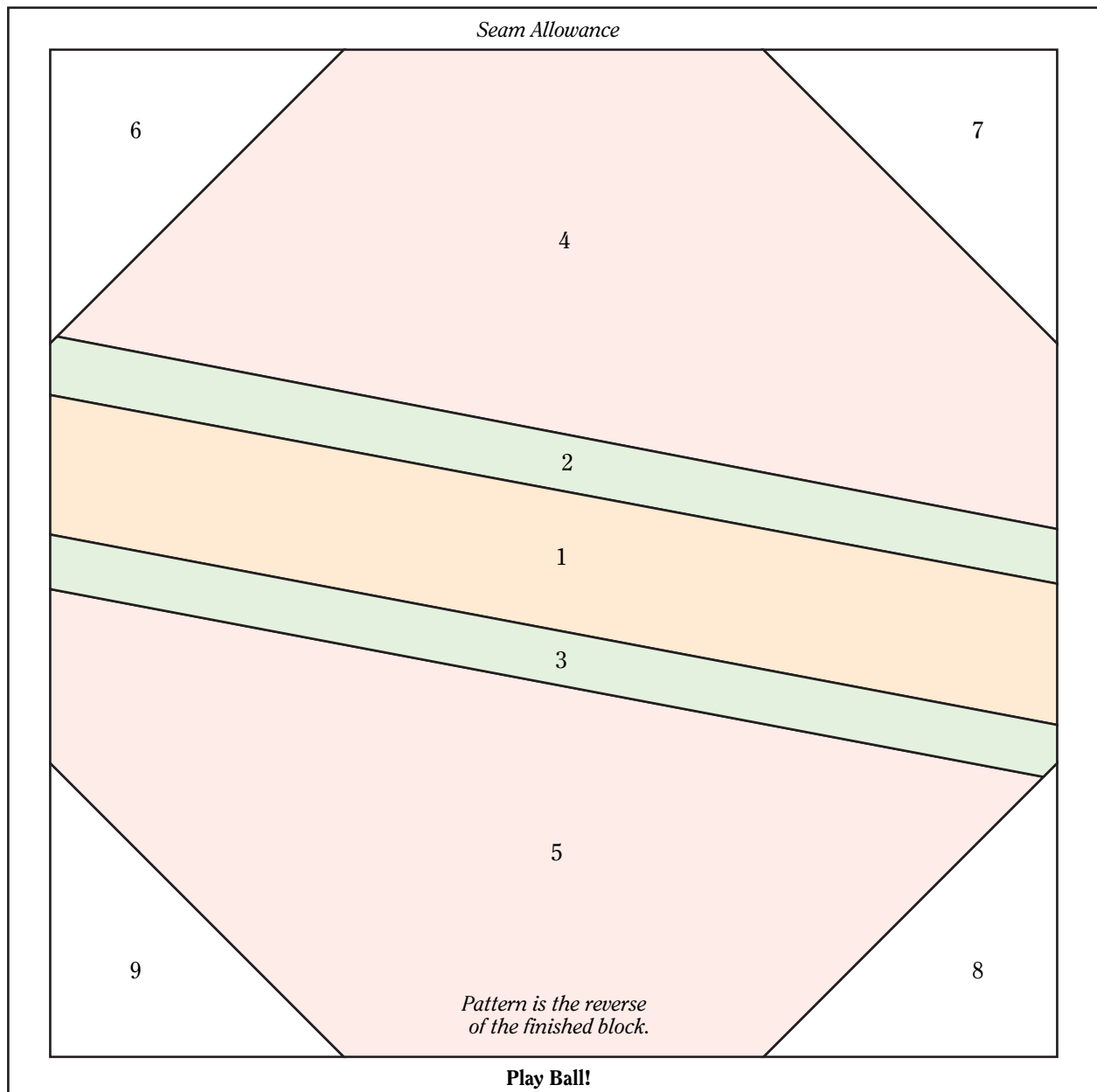

Tumbling Texture. Tactile stimulation for wee folks is the result when chenille is used for one of the ball stripes in this version. We used the alternate block on this variation.

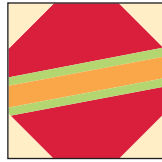

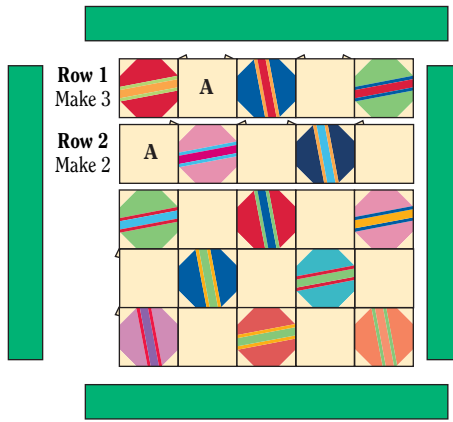
1 Making the Quilt Center

Make a total of 13 paper copies of the block foundation.

Foundation piece each ball in numerical order, pressing and trimming after each patch addition. Join the blocks and the A patches into row 1's and row 2's. Remove the foundation papers. Sew the rows together as shown.



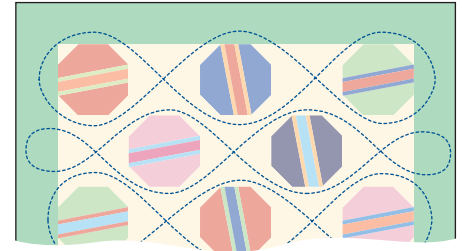

3 Quilting and Finishing

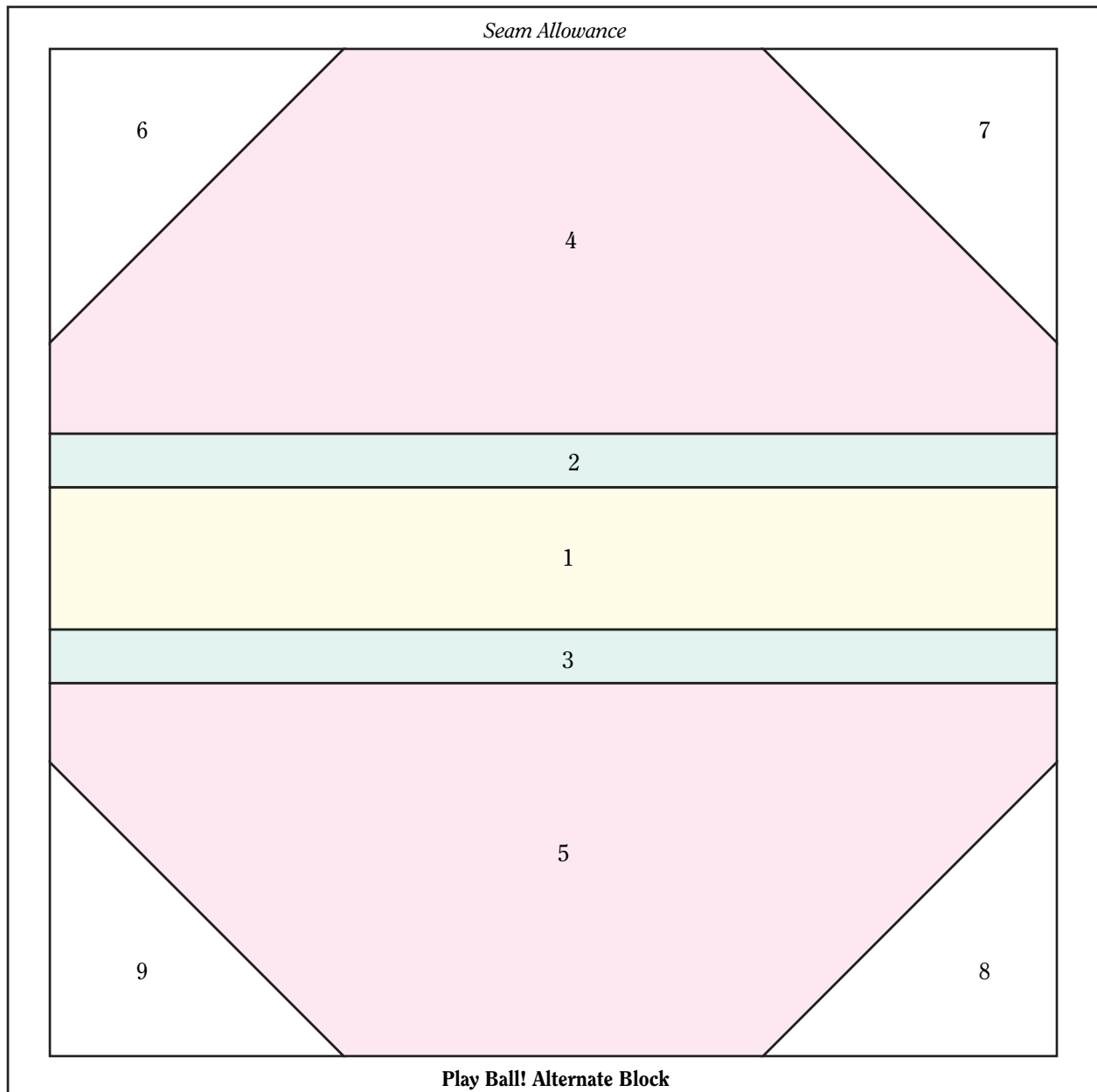
Layer and baste together the backing, batting and quilt top. Quilt large continuous figure 8's over the quilt as shown. Bind the quilt. ■

2 Adding the Borders

Sew the border side strips to the quilt and trim any extra length. Add the top and bottom border strips in the same way.
