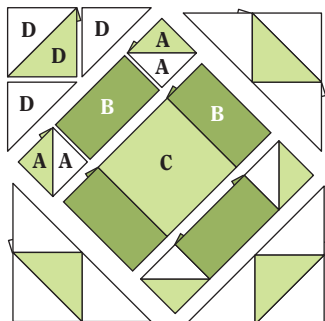


## What's Black & White and...

Scotch Squares

#### Scotch Squares

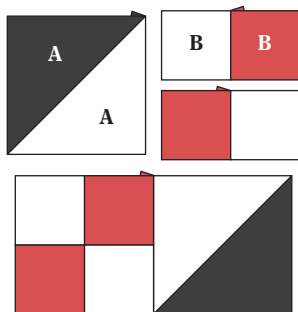
12" finished block

- 4 squares 3" x 3" (2 from each of 2 fabrics) cut diagonally to yield 8 triangles (A) ☒
- 4 rectangles (B) 2<sup>5</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x 4<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>"
- 1 square (C) 4<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 4<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>"
- 8 squares 3<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x 3<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" (2 from 1 fabric, 6 from 1 fabric) cut diagonally to yield 16 triangles (D) ☒

#### Railroad Crossing

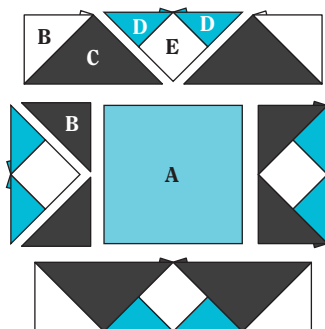
12" finished block

- 2 squares 6<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x 6<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" (1 from each of 2 fabrics) cut diagonally to yield 4 triangles (A) ☒
- 8 squares (B) 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" (4 from each of 2 fabrics)

Salt Lake City

#### Salt Lake City

12" finished block

- 1 square (A) 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"
- 4 squares 3<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x 3<sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" (2 from each of 2 fabrics) cut diagonally to yield 8 triangles (B) ☒
- 1 square 7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 7<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" cut diagonally twice to yield 4 triangles (C) ☒
- 2 squares 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" cut diagonally twice to yield 8 triangles (D) ☒
- 4 squares (E) 2<sup>5</sup>/<sub>8</sub>" x 2<sup>5</sup>/<sub>8</sub>"
