Cozy little cottage

materials

Finished Block: 5"

Assorted Scraps

5 fabrics for each block

cutting

Roof Fabric

1 rectangle (A) 1 1/2" x 5 1/2"

Background Fabric

5 squares (B) 1 1/2" x 1 1/2"

Chimney Fabric

2 squares (B) 1 1/2" x 1 1/2"

Door Fabric

1 rectangle (C) 1 1/2" x 2 1/2"

House Fabric

1 square (B) 1 1/2" x 1 1/2"

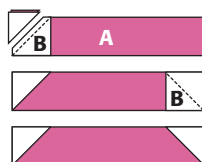
1 square (D) 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"

1 rectangle (E) 1 1/2" x 3 1/2"

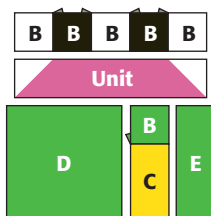
1 Making the Block

Use the stitch and flip method to create the (roof) unit: Place a B background patch at one end of A, right sides together. Mark and sew diagonally across B as shown. Trim the seam allowance to 1/4", open out the B patch and press. Repeat on the other end as shown to complete the unit.

Join the patches with the unit as shown to complete the block. ■
