

# Zoo-for-Two

One yardage, one cutting list—two quilts!



We're celebrating the launch of our brand new website with free patterns online. Zoo-for-Two gives one yardage and one cutting list, but makes two quilts in the end. Take a peek at our variation of this design called Lavender Fields—a beautiful throw-size quilt in soft purples. We hope you enjoy these bonus patterns, available only on the web.

## materials

**Two Crib Quilts:** 44" x 44" each  
Finished Blocks: 36"

**White Multiprint Flannel**

1 1/8 yards for large triangles

**Green and Blue Print Flannel**

7/8 yard for small triangles

**Pink Print Flannel**

1/2 yard for small triangles

**Blue Print Flannel**

1/4 yard for border corners

**Blue Stripe Flannel**

1 7/8 yards for border and binding

**Backing** 4 1/3 yards

**Batting** 2 at 48" x 48"

## cutting

**White Multiprint Flannel**

1 square 36 7/8" x 36 7/8" cut diagonally to yield 2 triangles (A)

**Green and Blue Print Flannel**

6 squares 12 7/8" x 12 7/8" cut diagonally to yield 12 triangles (B)

**Pink Print Flannel**

3 squares 12 7/8" x 12 7/8" cut diagonally to yield 6 triangles (B)

**Blue Print Flannel**

8 squares (C) 4 1/2" x 4 1/2"

**Blue Stripe Flannel**

8 strips 4 1/2" x 36 1/2" for borders

10 strips 2 1/4" x 40" for binding

Batting: Mountain Mist. Thread: Superior Threads.

## 1 About This Quilt

The clever concept behind this design yields two cuddly crib quilts. If your fabric is directional, as in the photographed quilt, pay attention to its orientation as you are cutting the patches. Handle the flannel carefully so as not to stretch the bias edges.

## 2 Making the Quilt Tops

Refer to the assembly diagram and join B patches with A to make the first quilt center.

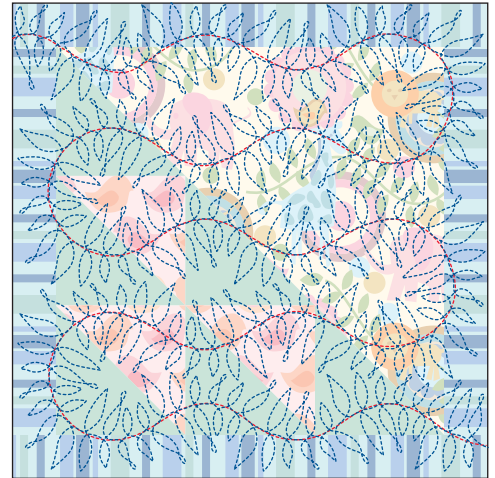
Sew a C patch to each end of 2 border strips to make the top and bottom borders. Matching centers and ends, sew a

border side strip to each side of the quilt center. Add the border top and bottom strips in the same way.

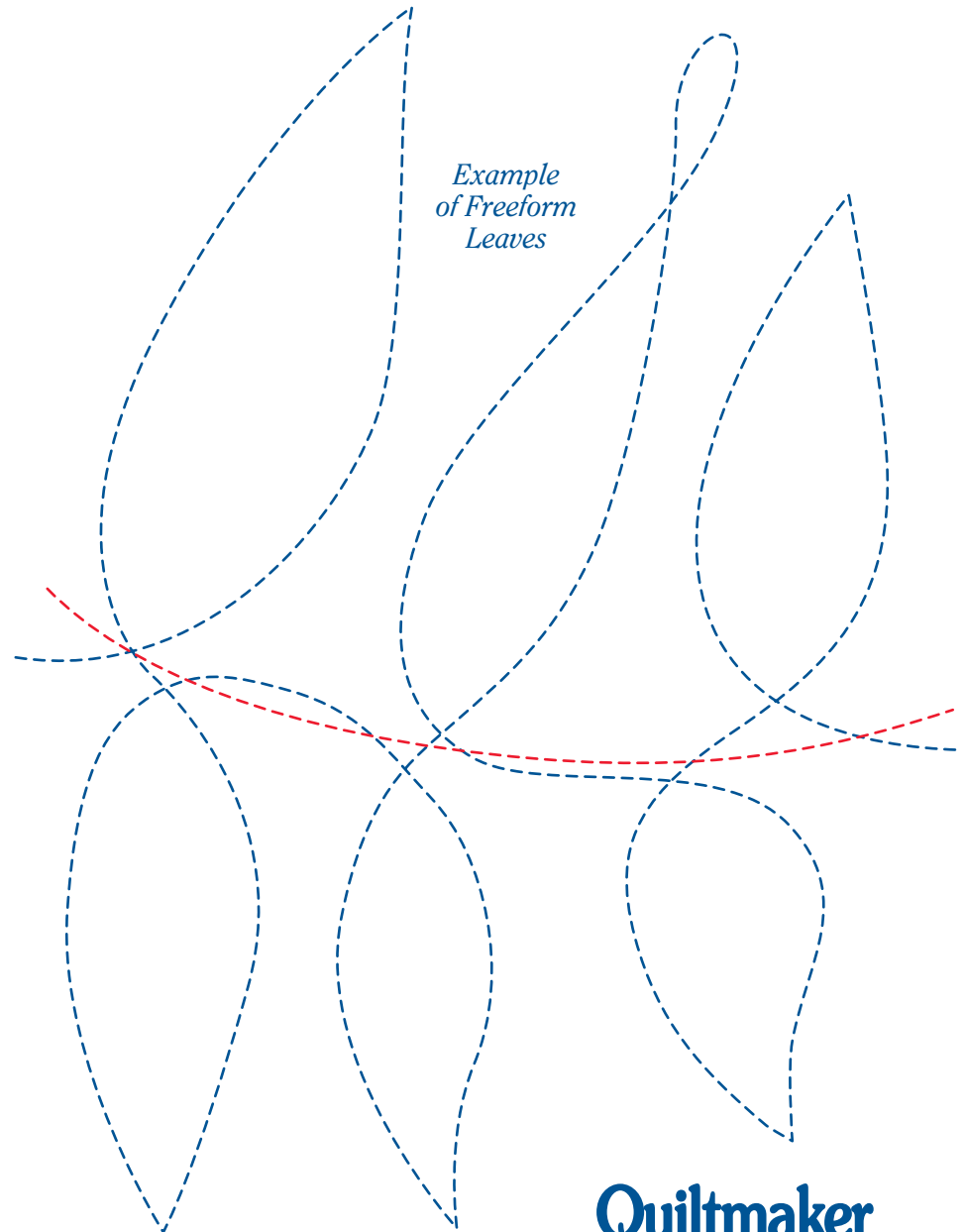
Repeat the process to make the second quilt top as shown.

## 3 Quilting and Finishing

Refer to the quilting placement diagram. Mark a large meander, as shown in red, back and forth across the first quilt top. Layer and baste together the backing, batting and quilt top. Quilt the marked meander. Quilt casual freeform leaves as shown on both sides of the meander. Bind the quilt. Repeat for the other quilt top. ■
